Biographical Note

William Emerson Baker was born in Roxbury Massachusetts on April 16, 1828. His parents Abel and Sarah (Reed) Baker had originally intended for their son to attend college; however, when Abel's business failed, William began working at a wool jabbing firm located in Boston at the age of 16. After spending a year as a low paid apprentice, Baker asked for the opportunity to earn commission based on the amount of business he could bring in. This move allowed Baker to save aggressively and by 1849 he had several thousand dollars which he sought to invest.

Through his work with the wool jabbing company Baker became acquainted with William O. Grover, a Boston area tailor who had recently purchased the manufacturing rights from Elias Howe for a sewing machine. Grover was looking for a partner to handle the development and marketing of the new machine he was interested in creating. Grover and Baker become partners forming the Grover & Baker company in 1850. The machine developed by Grover & Baker could take both the top and bottom threads from the spool which eliminated the need for a separate bobbin. The company was granted patents for their machine in 1851 and 1852 and the stitch created became known as the Grover & Baker stitch. The company soon spread from Boston with branch offices as far away as Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1854 – 1856 Baker traveled to Europe where he oversaw the spread of the company across the Atlantic.

By the time Baker returned to the United States in 1856, the company was well regarded and making a profit. This left Baker with more time and money for leisure activities. He was

interested in the topics of arts, science, and social reform. He gave his time and money liberally to institutions and causes related to these subjects. Baker married Charlotte Farnsworth of Roxbury on September 20, 1860. The couple had two sons, Edward T. Baker, and Walter Farnsworth Baker.

In 1868 Baker retired from active participation in Grover & Baker, but retained financial interest in the company until it was sold in 1876. Baker retired as a wealthy man and in 1886 began purchasing land in the southwest corner of Needham. Over the course of several years Baker would come to own nearly 800 acres of land. The Baker Estate in Needham, which served as the family's summer home, became known as Ridge Hill Farms. Over the course of Baker's ownership, the property was transformed into something closer to an amusement park in addition to a summer residence for a family. At its peak Ridge Hill Farms was home to over 100 attractions which included man-made lakes, bear pits, various exhibits, and a luxury hotel. Portions of the property were open to the public and Baker hosted a number of events, such as a funeral for a bear by the name of Billy Bruin. When the Town of Wellesley separated from West Needham in 1881, a portion of Ridge Hill Farms fell within the limits of the new town of Wellesley.

After Baker died in January 1888 Ridge Hill Farms was retained by the family for two years before it was sold. By the 1930's many of the larger buildings including Hotel Wellesley had been lost to fire. The smaller structures were sold or taken down, so that today all that remains from Ridge Hill Farms are the two man-made lakes. The majority of the land which originally was part of Ridge Hill Farms was divided up and developed into residential housing. Twenty five acres of the original estate was donated to Wellesley Conservation Council, Inc. through two separate donations made by Mr. and Mrs. William Guernsey to create Guernsey Sanctuary. The Guernseys first donated 13 acres of land on Sabrina Lake in 1961 and later added another 12 acres. The sanctuary includes a pine grove, woodlands, a vernal pond, island, swamp, as well as views of Sabrina Lake.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains materials related to William Emerson Baker, the Grover & Baker Sewing Machine company, and the Ridge Hill Farms property. The bulk of the collection is made up of historical research and writing pertaining to the development and decline of Ridge Hill Farms as well as photographs of the various attractions and buildings found at Ridge Hill Farms.
