Biographical Note

Katherine Bronson was a twin, the daughter of Melville and Sarah Elizabeth Bronson. She was born in Fall River, Bristol, Massachusetts on March 13, 1895, and died in Wellesley July 29, 1987. She began her teaching career at Wellesley High School in 1918, and taught business-related subjects, including typing, shorthand, law and English. Bronson also served as the Dean of Girls and Director of Girls Guidance. She served as sponsor for the student council; student life and involvement in the school's administration was one of her favorite projects.

During World War II she was appointed Interim Assistant Principal of Wellesley High School (WHS), a position she took over permanently in 1947. She served as assistant principal until her retirement in 1961. She graduated from the College of Business Education in Brockton, and took courses at Harvard University, Boston University, and Simmons College prior to teaching at WHS. After retirement she founded a post graduate educational center in Framingham, and then served as secretary-treasurer for the Hathaway House Bookshop. In addition to being involved with many Wellesley social and community organizations, she was involved in numerous regional and national professional organizations throughout her life.
