Historical Note

This collection contains the records of two Wellesley community improvement organizations, as well as the Constitution of a third. All three organizations were formed at roughly the same time, and all shared the same goals: the improvement and beautification of their respective Wellesley communities and neighborhoods. All three groups attended to business, but the meetings were also opportunities for more relaxed social engagement.

The Wellesley Village Improvement Association, founded 1905

"The objects of this Association shall be ... To beautify Wellesley Village by removal or concealment of unsightly objects" through tree and shrub planting and maintenance, and "to stimulate a general interest in improving the environment of our homes and community" (Bylaws, Article II). Constitution and Bylaws accepted May 31, 1905.

The Club did not meet from 1927 through 1938. The *Wellesley Ledger* reported that the Association re-formed to primarily deal with the destruction wrought by the hurricane of 1938, which had done extensive damage to the village cemetery and many headstones therein (*Ledger*, November 9, 1939, as well as in *The Townsman*, November 10, 1939). The club, inactive in the years 1927-1957 (with brief activity in 1939-1940), elected to transfer their remaining funds to the Wellesley Historical Society, which was done in January 1958.

Wellesley Fells Improvement Society, founded circa 1912

The Wellesley Fells Improvement Society worked toward the betterment of the Fells area of Wellesley, roughly the northwest area of the town bordering Natick and Weston. One of the prominent projects the organization undertook was the repurposing of the schoolhouse in the creation of the Fells Branch Library in 1923. The Society sponsored entertainments and lectures throughout the year. They also acted as a neighborhood watch, offering rewards for the "arrest of persons found destroying property or committing other nuisances in the vicinity." They installed trash bins at the crosswalks, and advocated with the town for the installation of electric lighting on the streets. Major issues included the safety of the Worcester Street/Weston Road intersection, and the desire for bus service on the Weston Road. They also encouraged residents to be good neighbors and cultivate gardens.

Hills and Falls Village Improvement Society of Wellesley, circa 1906

The Hills and Falls Village Improvement Society of Wellesley was organized into 10 districts covering Wellesley Hills, Falls, and Farms. Each district was overseen by elected members living in those neighborhoods. The neighborhood committees concerned themselves with the beautification of their neighborhoods, taking care of rubbish and the proper placement of signs and bulletins. According to their map, the Society districts covered the Hills and Falls area bounded by Kingsbury Street/Wellesley Avenue and the Weston/Newton/Needham borders.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains the records of two Wellesley community improvement organizations, the Wellesley Village Improvement Association, and the Wellesley Fells Improvement Society. It also contains a booklet containing only the Constitution of a third organization, the Hills and Falls Village Improvement Society of Wellesley. The bulk of the collection is from the Wellesley Village Improvement Association. See Scope and Content Note for each Series for more information.
