Biographical/Historical Note

From its beginnings in the mid-1920s until its closing in 1979, the Hathaway House Bookshop was lauded as a "literary institution with more than a local reputation" (*Boston Globe*, August 1, 1979; p. 49). Located at 103 Central Street, the historic 1830 home was once the residence of Rebecca Morse Hathaway, who inherited the house in 1872. Wellesley College faculty members Julia Orris and R. Phillips Bradley purchased the property, and opened the bookshop in 1925. It was officially formed as a cooperative on May 27, 1927.

The Bookshop served as the *de facto* Wellesley College bookstore, but its mission was also to serve the wider Wellesley community and local residents. The Wellesley College campus bookstore closed in 1926 with the express understanding that Hathaway House Bookshop would serve their needs; in addition to expanding to accommodate the stocking of textbooks, the shop hired additional employees to oversee this aspect of the business. For a number of years the shop also maintained a small store on campus, in the Music Hall, which stocked stationary items (*Townsman*, September 17, 1926; p. 1).

Fire nearly destroyed the building on Friday, June 16, 1944. Much of the stock of books was lost to fire, smoke, and water damage. Quick restoration was considered a priority, as the bookstore served not only Wellesley College students, but also the United Sates Naval Supply School located on the college campus (Box 1, Folder 10, letter). The store was able to reopen quickly,

and much of the credit for the reopening can be given to the strong relationship between the shop, its reading clientele, and writers. Christopher Morley and Ogden Nash were just two notable writers who contributed to help the store rebuild in the aftermath of the fire.

The shop was a community mainstay until its closing on August 1, 1979. In an article about the closing, the *Townsman* noted that what made the shop "unique" was that it belonged "not to a person, but to an ideal," going on to note that "Hathaway House is a town landmark, an institution, and a friend. For some, this has been a lifelong friendship" (*Townsman*, July 5, 1979; p. 1).

After the closing of the bookshop, the building housed Stuart Swan Furniture until 2017; it is currently being used as office space, once again under the name Hathaway House.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains business and other materials pertaining to the operations, business, and events of the Hathaway House Bookshop. The widest variety of materials can be found in Series 1, which includes newsletters, correspondence, and articles celebrating the events and activities which took place at the shop. Included are book publishing lists, and histories celebrating the history of the shop as well as the history of the building in which it was housed.

One of the highlights is the Guest Registers, which contain signatures, and often artwork, by visitors as well as celebrated authors from the 1920s into the 1970s, including Carl Sandburg (1936), Maurice Sendak (1966, with illustration), Christopher Morley (1944), Tasha Tudor (1968, with illustration), Thornton Wilder (1950), and Marjorie Flack Benét (with illustration), just to name a few.

Other materials in the collection include store merchandise, newspaper clippings, scrapbooks, non-photographic images such as logos and a copperplate print used in the course of business, and photographs.
