Biographical Note

The Rollins family can be traced back to Strafford County, New Hampshire, from the late eighteenth century. John A. Rollins (1791-1882) and Mary Ann Leighton (Copp) Rollins (1810-1847), of New Hampshire, were the parents of Hiram Rollins (1827-1868).

Hiram was married to Mary Caroline "Carrie" Bigelow (1831-1906) on December 13, 1853 in Chelsea, Massachusetts; after their marriage and the birth of their first child they settled in West Needham (later incorporated as Wellesley in 1881). Hiram served in the U.S. Military. Maj. Hiram and Mary were the parents of Harry Leighton Rollins, Sr.; Hiram died in 1868, and Mary in 1906.

Harry Leighton Rollins (1861-1933) was born in Chelsea, and moved with his parents to Wellesley soon after his birth. He married Margaret Wilson Anderson (1867-1951), a graduate of Dana Hall School, on December 6, 1898 at Wellesley Congregational Church. They resided at "The Homestead," located at 646 Washington Street, Wellesley. Harry Sr. was a lawyer, practicing in Wellesley and Boston; he was a member of the American Ornithologists' Union and the New England Historic Genealogical Society. He drowned in the Charles River on March 27, 1933. Harry and Margaret were the parents of Leighton Rollins (Harry Leighton Rollins, Jr.).

Leighton Rollins was born on August 6, 1900 in Wellesley, Massachusetts. He was educated in private schools, and attended Brown University, where he was involved in theater. He was active in theater production, but also was a noted lecturer on theater and theater history. He founded the Surry Playhouse in Bar Harbor, Maine, where he served as president and managing director. He eventually settled in California, where he died on June 29, 1981 in San Francisco.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains materials belonging to or related to members of the Rollins family. One half of the collections pertains to Mary Leighton Rollins, Leighton Rollins, Harry Leighton Rollins, and Margaret Rollins. The second half of the collection contains materials related to the life and work of Hiram Rollins.
