Biographical Note

James A. Tartari (1942 –)

James Tartari was born in Framingham on October 1, 1942 and first lived at 13 Donizetti Street, the third generation to live in the home. When he was eight the family moved to 6 Simpson Road, where he still resides today. He attended Wellesley High School from 1957 – 1960; at the time the High School was only grades 10–12. He received his B.S.Ed. from Bridgewater State College in 1964, and his M.A. from the University of Massachusetts in 1966. He served in the United States Air Force from 1966 – 1972, during the Vietnam War. Tartari was given a commission, received officer training, and achieved the rank of Captain. He was assigned to the 1956 Communications Group in Fuchu, Japan in 1969; in 1971 he was assigned Headquarters Squadron Commander to the Group. Following his service, he served as a PREP instructor in Europe, providing high school educations to military officers who were unable to complete high school; in 1974 –1975 he served as a teacher at the Frankfurt International School. He went on to serve as an administrator for high school completion programs for the military, acting as an administrator, guidance counselor, and management analyst. He is now retired and resides in Wellesley.

Antonio Tartari (1912 – 1967)

Antonio Tartari was the father of James A. and brother of Joseph Tartari. He was born October 9, 1912; he died January 20, 1967. Tartari was inducted into the U.S. Military for service in World War II, entering active service on July 7, 1943. He lived at 13 Donizetti Street, Wellesley.

During the war he served as a Technician 5^{th} Grade (TEC-5) with the 8^{th} Infantry Division; his dates of service were 1943 - 1945.

Joseph Tartari (1917 – 1943)

Ensign Joseph Tartari was the son of Alfonso Tartari, brother of Antonio, of 13 Donizetti Street. He was a graduate of Wellesley High School where he played on the football team; received his B.S. from Northeastern University in 1939. Born Wellesley 5 February 1917, he enlisted as a cadet in the U. S. Naval Air Force October 1941, during World War II. He was sent to Florida in March 1942, was commissioned in July. From October 1942 he served as pilot instructor in California; he was killed in an airplane accident 17 January 1943. He is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery, Needham, Massachusetts.
