Biographical Note

The Wellesley Farms Neighborhood Club was formed 1916. According to their 1934 Constitution, the "object of this Club is to promote neighborhood friendliness and to work for any worthy object which may be approved by vote of the Club" (Constitution, 1934 version). The club acted as a type of neighborhood improvement society, but they were predominantly concerned with social activities within the membership circle.

During World War II they were heavily involved with the Red Cross sewing and producing dressings and bandages for the war effort. The club focused on many other philanthropical activities, not limiting themselves solely to the town of Wellesley.

Wellesley Farms is generally the area around Glen Road, where the Wellesley Farms MBTA station is located.

II. Board Records, 1916-1982

This series contains the records of the executive board. The board structured their meetings around the academic calendar, meeting about 12 times a year from October through May until the 1940s, when they decided on monthly meetings; the club's activities were year-round. Box 3, Folder 8 (1960-1961) contains a list of all club presidents from 1916-1961, as well as a copy of the Bylaws. Amended versions of the Bylaws and Constitution can be found in Box 2, Folder 4 (1933-1934). Each year, in May, the club Secretary submitted an annual report. Box 2, Folder 6 contains the 1936 annual report, which includes a retrospective history of the group at the time of its 20^{th} anniversary.

The board meetings followed a pattern. First, the business meeting, after which the hostesses would take over, and the members would participate in a wide range of activities, from games, to knitting, presentations, and cooking, just to name a few. The group also acted as a book club, with members agreeing to read and discuss chosen books. Members greeted newcomers to the neighborhood, visited the sick and mourning, and raised funds for various projects, both local and international.

The materials in this series include meeting minutes, descriptions of various social activities, treasurer and secretary reports, correspondence, member lists, and other business-related material.

IV. Notebook (Grenfell Mission), 1954-1958

This spiral-bound notebook/scrapbook contains information and correspondence pertaining to the Grenfell Mission. During the 1950s the Club elected to support the Grenfell Mission as one of its philanthropy recipients; members of the Club were associated with the New England Grenfell Association (New England Friends of the Grenfell Mission) in Boston. Additionally, the Mission was supported by the Wellesley Branch of the New England Needlework Guild, which shared membership with several of the women in the Wellesley Farms Neighborhood Club. The Mission provided support for people living in the difficult conditions in rural Newfoundland and Labrador. This notebook contains correspondence, newspaper clippings, and other information associated with local support for the Grenfell Mission.
